FROM THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER

The San Juan Wildlife Federation (SJWF) hosted a Fun Shoot at their range in Farmington and it was another new experience for me. I met with the SJWF members at 8:00am and went through a safety briefing and explanation of how to shoot this match. We were on the 100 yard bench rest range and the weather was just perfect...no wind. We were shooting match rifles, that cost around \$2500.00, and they were already set up on the benches. There are 6 individual targets on each Official Hunter Rifle Target, with a sight-in target on the bottom right corner. The overall target is 4 inches wide, with a ½ inch 10 ring and 1/16 inch X-ring. With the calibrated bench rest instruments, all we had to do was to turn a knob for elevation and another knob for left or right until the cross-hairs were centered on the target. The trigger was probably 1 or 2 pounds, so you didn't want to touch the trigger until you were ready to shoot. After your sight-in round (or rounds) you then fired one round in each of the other 5 targets. Also, getting the round in the 10 ring, was not as easy as described above.

The SJWF shooters that morning were Mike Freestone, President of SJWF; Myron Crockett, Board Mem-

ber & National bench rest shooter; Jim Crockett, Myron's son; Denver DeWees, Board Member & Chief Instructor and Lynn Wood, National bench rest shooter. Our host was Anna Kinney who provided Dunkin donuts and good coffee. Anna also puts out the SJWF newsletter, and she is the Youth Sportsfest Director.

Bond Kinney is the Outdoor Range Officer and he took me to the new cowboy shooting area which has just been completed. There is a whole series of berms with steel plates, wagons, buildings to shoot from, wooden horses and much more. It is a very impressive cowboy shooting area.

If you are Angel Fire on the 18th & 19th of September, you might want to attend the Angel Fire Fall Sports EXPO at the community center. NMSSA will have a table at that event which is an opportunity to visit with folks in the northern part of the state.

Have you signed up a new NMSSA member this month? The "Clubs" contest continues. What rifle or handgun (maybe a pair) would your club like to win?

New Mexico Shooting Sports Association members have contributed \$587.00 so far, and we have been promised another \$200.00 which will take us to \$787.00. This is the last reminder

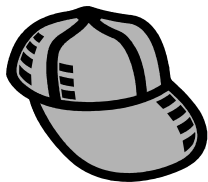
that we will have in the Shooting News. If you would like to have your name on the list of contributors, I will need to hear from you by September 30, 2004.

A CALL TO ARMS By Paul C. Lisle

This is a very critical election year and the most important election ever for gun owners. The next president will select up to four Supreme Court Justices. If John Kerry is the President, it is a given that he will select at least one of the Justices from California's Ninth Court of Appeals. This is the court that ruled the Second Amendment is not an individual right. If this judge and the other new judges vote this same way, it will only be a matter of time until we will no longer be able to own guns. John Kerry has voted against our gun rights over 50 times in his nineteen years in the Senate. He has never voted for any gun right. No matter how much you disagree with President Bush, if you want to keep your guns, you better vote for him.

Thanks to the political contacts of our President, Charlie Weisleder, Charlie and I were able to attend the rallies for both Vice President Cheney and President Bush. I can prove I was at the Bush rally as my face was in the group picture on the front page of the Albuquerque Journal the next day. I was very impressed with both rallies. President Bush did an outstanding job. For over an hour he stood alone on the platform and told us his views and reasoning for doing what he is doing, including the war in Iraq. For the next half hour he answered questions from the crowd. Why the war in Iraq? It is better to fight terrorism there than here. The reason my picture was in the paper is that retired Navy Capt. Ken Longway stood up and told the President that he supported him on the war effort. Ken Longway was seated just in front and a little to the left of me. (Charlie didn't get his picture in the paper as he was sitting directly behind Ken.) President bush said, "I know what I'm doing when it comes to winning this war". He also said:

*"There's an enemy out there which hates us because of what we believe. And you cannot negotiate with them, you cannot talk sense into them".

*"We must bring them to justice in places where they hide and plot, so we do not have to face them here at home."

*"When we see a threat, we must take it seriously before it fully materializes."

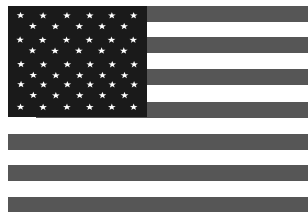

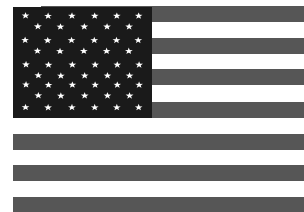
The Legislature will have only six days after it reconvenes in September to renew the Assault Weapon Ban. It won't happen and the Assault Weapon Ban will expire on September 13th. What can we expect to see when this happens? I predict absolutely nothing. The overseas AK-47 makers may start putting bayonets and folding stocks back on their rifles but this will only be after they have sold the rifles they produced under the ban. Large capacity magazines have always been available. It will be interesting to see how the Feds will try to handle magazines that are marked "Law Enforcement Use Only". Will civilians be allowed to own these magazines now that the ban is gone? I also believe there will still be a market for the 10 round magazines that replaced the hi-caps during the ban.

The Albuquerque Comcast channel 27 TV show that I produce and co-host "Gun Collectors of New Mexico" is doing very well. It is on every fourth Thursday from 6:00 to 7:00 PM. This is a time change from the old time of 8:00 to 9:00 PM. As a result of the new time some of our helpers cannot make the show. If anyone wants to learn and become a part of a live, call-in TV show, give me a call at 299-3933 for details. My TV show has been given credit for helping get our concealed carry law, in that I interviewed and taped Bill Richardson when he was running for Governor. Bill said on camera that he supported our Second Amendment rights and would sign a Concealed Carry bill if it got to his desk. I played this recorded interview twice on my TV show before the election and the rest is history. By the way, Governor Richardson did a lot more to help us get concealed carry than just sign the bill into law. As a footnote, the NRA asked for a copy of my tape of Bill Richardson and, of course, I gave them one.

If you are not registered to vote, register. Get your relatives, friends and co-workers to register. Remember that our opponents are paying workers to register people to vote against us.







Franklin Mt. Gun Club

As president of the *Franklin Mt. Gun Club* in El Paso Texas, I would like to invite *NMSSA* members and their friends to come shoot with us if you are in the area. We shoot two NRA High Power Rifle Matches and a Fun Match every month, all year around.

On the first Sunday of every month we shoot a Highpower rifle match at the *Ysleta Gun Club*, northeast of Hueco Tanks State Park, east of El Paso, off the Carlsbad Highway (62-180). This is an 80-shot Regional match course on a 600 yard range with pit service.

On the second and third Sunday we shoot at the *Ft. Bliss Rod and Gun Club*, off of Railroad drive in the NE part of the city. The second Sunday match is fired on a 200/300 yard range, with no pit service. A reduced target is used at 300 for the slow fire prone stage. This is also an 80 shot match.

The third Sunday is a 50 shot fun match generally based on the 50-shot National Match course, with modifications. It is fired

at 100 yards, using any rifle and allowing 2 minute rapid fire times, and starting in position for those shooting rifles not easily reloadable in the correct time. This is a good match to zero in your hunting rifles, (scopes are allowed) or to see how well that SKS you bought will group on paper. It also gives a new shooter a taste of what competition shooting is like, and we get several new shooters started in this fashion. (You will learn that an SKS does not make a very good match rifle.)

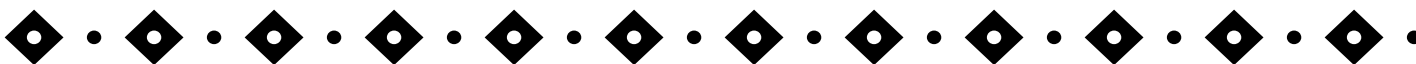
We also hold a NRA 2 day regional match in February. a 2 day "Octoberfest" match in October, and a John C. Garand Match in March and September each year.

Hunting and Conservation Stuff

I am alive and halfway well so I will pen a few facts and thoughts for you all.

The Game Commission continues to operate in a "make sense" and use good science mode. The new effort to determine whether our mule deer are adequately fed (have sufficient natural food available) is a good step in working through the declining deer population problem. If you shoot a deer, note whether it has fat or whether it is skinny. Tell the Game Department.

The anti-hunting organizations continue to run wild through state legislatures and courts. They are well funded, very aggressive, and won't quit. They are

even trying to stop bear hunting in Maine and Alaska. They are trying to ban trapping in New Mexico. In New York, New Jersey, Florida, Maryland and on and on, they are attacking us. The ban on trapping in Colorado had already forced some small herd sheep ranchers out of business. The big problems we have with anti-hunting is the same we have with anti-gun issues. The antis are rich, have great exposure, are relentless in their attacks, and hate our guts.

The NRA is getting firmly into the pro-hunt action. Look carefully at your latest NRA magazine cover.

FUN SHOTS AND EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETINGS

We have two fun shoots in the planning stages, but we have not confirmed those dates. We expect the October fun shoot will be at the New Mexico Big-horn Gun Club range located 20 miles east of Albu-

Non-subgun owners will have a chance to shoot some of the competitors firearms if they bring their own ammo and load the magazines (9mm or .45)

LOS ALAMOS SPORTSMEN'S CLUB - HIGHPOWER RIFLE MATCHES 2004 SCHEDULE

The Club will shoot a National Match Course of fire each month for 7 months. Match dates are Sundays: High Power Clinic, September 5, October 3, and November 7. These matches are at the club range in Rendija Canyon. Registration at Los Alamos begins at 07:30 AM and will close at 08:20 AM with the match starting at 08:30 AM. Match fee is \$10.00.

Juniors pay \$5.00. Ammunition is available to purchase for use at the match.

Juniors must be 14 years of age or older and be accompanied by a parent for parental permission.

Competition will be shoulder to shoulder within NRA classes. Current NRA rules will apply to all matches and all classes. Rifles (the Club has M1

Garands), mats, spotting scopes, and shooting gloves are available at the Club for use at matches. Eye and hearing protection is MANDATORY. Bring a coat, sweatshirt, or shooting jacket, in the prone position you will be shooting while your elbows are on the ground. A hat and water is also of benefit.

Two sighting shots will be allowed and can be taken in any position in a time limit of two minutes before each course of fire.

Awards for the Los Alamos matches are as follows: Classes will be combined upward if there are 2 or fewer in a class. Second in class will be given if there are 4 or more shooters in a class and third in class will be given if there are 6 or more shooters in a class. Awards within classes will be - \$3.00 for 1st, \$2.00 for 2nd,

\$1.00 for 3rd. The match winner in each course of fire will receive \$4.00. Juniors will receive ribbons for first and second places. No separate distinction for women.

Shooters will set-up and take down the range and targets and score competitors targets. Competitors may be asked to assist with range operations.

All range and match safety procedures shall be followed. Rifles, mats, gloves, safety, and match tutoring are

available at Los Alamos. Safety, rifle, and match procedure tutoring should be done before participating in a competitive match. Normal tutoring can not be done the day of the match.

Firing one full match qualifies the competitor for the purchase of your own M1 Garand from the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP).

Rifle range will be closed to non-competitors during scheduled matches.

ATOMIC CITY SECTIONAL 2004: THE IPSC NEW MEXICO STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

About 60 enthusiastic shooters from five states competed in the 2004 IPSC/USPSA New Mexico State Championship at the Los Alamos Sportsmen's Club on the weekend of 10-11 July. The match consisted of eight stages, each competitor firing a minimum of 206 rounds, for well over 12,000 rounds downrange.

The match required a cooperative effort by the LASC and other New Mexico clubs, notably Farmington and Albuquerque, in designing and erecting stages, providing equipment and props, administration, and numerous other ways. The NM Section has run the annual event in this way for several years now, rotating through clubs in the state with various clubs, including the LASC, contributing.

Stages.

Eight courses of fire were set up in the pistol bays and on the rifle range. The two stages on the rifle range were separated by large steel dumpsters impervious to pistol bullets. The match included run and gun field courses, speed shoots (stand and shoot as fast as you can, but don't hit the no-shoot targets because the penalties are costly), and a classifier.

Of the eight stages, the one that seemed to cause the most heartburn (because it was just plain nasty and difficult) required 32-rounds on 8 paper and 16 steel targets. Paper requires two scoring hits and steel must be knocked down. The challenge arose from four round plates that were visible to the shooter for two very brief periods



as a no-shoot target rotated out-in-out-in of the field of view. The shooter had to step on a trap to initiate the period of visibility. Only two of the 60 competitors were able to knock all four plates down. It's like one of those exams that nobody's expected to finish and gets graded on a curve.

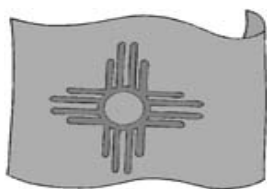
One more way to make life difficult is to use swinging or rotating targets. A different 32-round stage had swingers put into action by knocking down a steel target, the swingers being partially obscured by no-shoot targets. Additionally, the course had a rotating target that was briefly visible as it turned edge to edge, also actuated by stepping on a trap. This stage was hard for everyone too.

The challenge of the speed shoots was that the targets were festooned with no-shoots. A hit on a no-shoot results in a 10-point penalty; not so good when the max for a good scoring hit is 5 points.

Equipment Divisions

There are separate divisions of equipment in IPSC competition. In this match there were entrants in Revolver, Production, Limited 10, Limited, and Unlimited Divisions. These divisions don't compete against each other; each is scored separately as a separate match.

- Revolver division is self-explanatory
- Production guns are essentially out-of-the-box, often in 9 mm
- Limited 10 guns are typically, but not limited to, single-stack Mod 1911s in .45 ACP, with only 10 rounds allowed in the magazine
- Limited guns are generally in .40 S&W with wide-body frames and high-capacity magazines, but without optical sights or compensators.
- Unlimited (or Open) guns are the exotics, usually in .38 Super, with more-or-less whatever you can afford to hang on them.

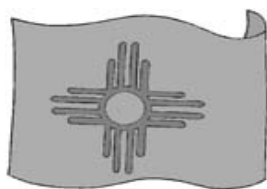

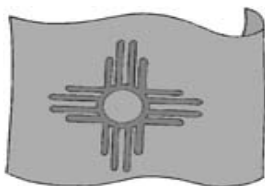

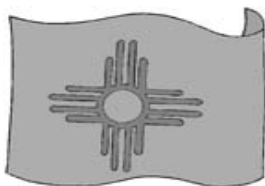
