FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT

Most of us agree that the New Mexico Shooting Sports Association is an organization that is worth our time, money and effort. That is why we are members. That is why we read the newsletters and participate in the Association Annual meetings and other activities. All of those activities are fun, informative and useful.

However when you think about the purpose of the NMSSA it is clear that the most helpful function of the Association is its political activity. NMSSA evaluates candidates for elective office. It publishes the candidate's answers to questions of interest. It watches legislative activity at State, County and City levels. It formulates legislative actions and lobbies to achieve those goals. For most members, this is a primary source of information and the first line of defense in protecting our sport.

Could NMSSA be more effective in its political effort? It is clear that it could, if it had additional resources. Perhaps those resources are readily at hand. The idea of expanding the contents and utility of the Associations membership list was suggested at the NRA Annual Meeting, 2006. Please consider and comment on this idea.

Would the membership be interested in providing the Association with additional information about each member's background, skills, civic or political connections, State Representative voting district and other usable facts? The information would be used to identify people who could help solve specific problems facing the association.

As an example, the current Treasurer for the association is an accountant. Her professional skills contribute a great benefit to the association. If the association faced a situation in which the skills of a carpenter were needed it would be helpful to know which members to contact to request help or advise. If an Attorney is needed it would certainly serve the association well to know who to call on to obtain assistance.

Politically, knowledge of voting district identification would be a benefit if a proposed law was being heard in a committee and one of the members of that committee has an Association member as a constituent. In N.M. Legislature, a call or e-mail from someone in a home district has a significant impact on the Representative's actions.

The Association would need to develop a method of searching the data base to identify the appropriate people who might be able to provide help as well as a method of informing those people of the issue and requesting action from them.

Please offer your comments, pro or con, concerning this proposal. Providing the detailed information would not be required as a condition of membership. Voluntary compliance would be of great assistance to the Association.

This proposal is just one of the ideas that will be presented to the membership for discussion. Watch the Newsletter for additional proposals. It is the intention of the Association leadership to solicit the membership's input for the purpose of making the NMSSA a more effective and meaningful organization.

A CALL TO ARMS

The NRA sponsored National Police Pistol Competition is coming to Albuquerque. The legislators in February approved and the Governor signed a bill for almost \$1.4 million to build a new100 turning target range at the city's west mesa range. From September 28 to 30 the regional competition will be held and 250 shooters are expected to participate. The national competition will take place October 1 to 5 with 500 shooters expected to compete. The competitors will shoot at 7, 15, 25 and 50 yards. They will each shoot 150 rounds in their attempt to reach the top score of 1,500. If you are in Albuquerque during those dates, you can be a part of this huge competition.

Approximately 80 volunteers per day will be needed to make this event successful. Shooting hours will be from 08:00 to 15:00. The volunteers will be doing a variety of jobs such as target handling, verifying scoring and directing parking in the new 500-car parking lot. A new vendors building is being built to house the displays of all of the gun manufactures and related venders that will be attending this event. To volunteer, give me a call at 299-3933. Since I am a NRA qualified range safety officer, I assume that is what I will be doing during the competition.

It appears that the Department of Public Safety is still having problems issuing concealed carry licenses. I submitted my request for a new 4-year license exactly 60 days before my current license expired. I was told that was the earliest that I could submit the paper work, money and fingerprint cards. Guess what? My old license expired and I still hadn't received my new license. Since I thought something like this might happen, I have a valid Florida concealed carry license that allowed me to still carry in New Mexico. Last month I applied for, but have not received, a Utah concealed carry license, which will allow me to carry in a few more states than my Florida and New Mexico licenses now allow. On August 5th I did receive my new license, two weeks after my old license expired.

There are a number of pro-gun bills pending in Congress that require your action. The following list was e-mailed to me by the NRA and I am passing it on for you to take action. You can contact your U.S. Representative at (202) 225-3121, and your U.S. Senator at (202) 224-3121 and urge them to support the following measures. H.R. 5092 - This bill would improve BATFE's process for punishing the few FFL's who violate the law. This bill was drafted in large part to address BATFE abuses at the recent Richmond, VA gun shows. H.R. 5005 - This bill rolls back restrictions and corrects errors in federal firearm laws. H.R. 5013/S. 2599 - Legislation to prohibit the confiscation of lawfully owned firearms during states of emergency, as happened in last years hurricanes. H.R. 1384 -This bill would remove several antiquated and unnecessary restrictions imposed on the interstate firearms business by the 1968 gun

control act. H.R. 1288/S. 1082 – Legislation to repeal the D.C. gun ban so that people can arm and defend themselves in the District. H.R. 4547/S. 3275 – Legislation that would allow any person with a valid carry permit or license issued by a state to carry a concealed firearm in any other state when they meet certain requirements. The laws of each state governing where concealed firearms may be carried would still apply.

On July 7, 2006, a two-week UN conference on how to eliminate private ownership of guns worldwide ended. This meeting was a confutation between the U.S. and the rest of the world. Thanks to our pro-gun administration, the conference ended in deadlock with nothing being decided. This was a huge victory for U.S. gun owners. I would hate to think what would have happened at this conference if we had an anti-gun Clinton (either President or Senator) administration.

This will be my last column before the November elections. I can't stress hard enough the importance of voting for pro-gun candidates. You should know by now who the good guys are. Since this newsletter will be published with-in the 60 days before an election band on my freedom of speech, my recommending whom to vote for, at this time, would be breaking the law.

The first ever New Mexico State NRA Cowboy Lever Action Rifle Silhouette Championships & the first Hunter Pistol Championships in many years was held at the NRA Whittington center in July 2006, attended by 47 shooters from seven states.

Enough New Mexico residents participated to form a postal team in the two rifle events. This allows New Mexico to compete against the other 49 states for a gold, silver or bronze medal. Postal results will be posted in Shooting Sports USA in the spring of 2007. We had five juniors compete but only one from New Mexico, all five of these were eligible to advance to the National Championships with a free entry. Logan Williams of Raton was our youngest competitor at age 10. Logan shot a personal best score. Way to go Logan!

Eight national records were set during these events. Four super seniors (70+) were in attendance, aged 74 to 82.

Thanks to Charlie & Mary Weisleder for coming & selling NMSSA memberships, hats & shirts. It is nice to have an executive committee member to represent the state association at these championships. We also thank them for the personal contribution to our raffle.

Anyone wishing to try out a silhouette event, get hold of Ron, we always have a gun & ammo for a friend.

Over \$2500.00 was contributed to the NRA Whittington Center as a result of this championship. Questionnaires were mailed to all candidates running for the New Mexico State House of Representatives. The questionnaires specifically asked candidates their stance on our 2nd Amendment rights. The results were tabulated on an A+ through F- basis. An A+ indicates extreme support for the 2nd Amendment; and F equals no support; and an F- goes to those who introduce

anti-gun legislation. A question mark indicates no questionnaire was received or a grade could not be tabulated based on answers provided. The ratings will appear in the Special 2006 election Edition.

The special edition will cover the Federal Election Candidates who are running for US Representative in Districts 1, 2 and 3.

We will also cover candidates run-

ning for Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Commissioner of Public Lands, and Bernalillo County Sheriff.

The General Election will be Tuesday, November 7, 2006. Absentee voting and early voting will start on Friday, August 25.

Muzzle Loading By Tony Trennel

With some luck you have drawn a muzzleloader tag for big game. This takes the hunting sport a step further by combining the one-shot challenge (rarely does one get the chance to reload and shoot again) with nostalgic awareness this has been done for over 250 years.

A program of the National Muzzle Loading Rifle Association (NMLRA) called the Longhunter was founded to promote and preserve the sport of muzzleloading hunting as well as provide a common affiliation for such hunters while enhancing field experience.

Longhunter recognizes hunters who have chosen the challenge of hunting with muzzleloading firearms and honors the North American big game animals harvested by them. Longhunter endeavors to improve and expand muzzleloading seasons and to conserve North American wildlife habitat.

The Big Game Records Pro-

gram is the only trophy-recognition program strictly for the muzzleloading hunter. Longhunter recognizes 32 species of recordclass North American big game animals acquired with muzzleloading firearms. The hunters who have taken them while meeting the Longhunter's Fair Chase standards are recognized in the Longhunter Muzzleloading Big Game Records book. This leather-bound volume provides a permanent archive of trophy-class animals acquired through use of muzzleloading firearms. Other parts of this program includes a Muzzleloading Big Game Pin for the species and three levels of plaque awards; Triple trophy, Grand Slam and Royal Slam for acquiring three, four and five subspecies of North American turkeys.

More of the specifics for these programs will be addressed in the next NMSSA Newsletter. You can call Joyce for specifics earlier if necessary and that same address or number will get you to the membership folks if you care to join NMLRA. The organization's publication Muzzle Blasts covers a wide variety of topics from information on modern and traditional muzzleloading methods and techniques to environmental and legislative issues; from proper care of a muzzleloader to ballistic data; from field photos of trophy animals to the latest information on the Big Game Records Program. The magazine also "takes" you to some of the most exciting hunts in the world where some are hunts are once-in-alifetime where animals are the largest ever taken with a muzzleloader.
